TERMS AND CONDITIONS TO ATTEND ORIENTATION COURSE

- LECTURER ON <u>CONTRACT/AD-HOC/TEMPORARY POST</u>, MAY PLEASE TREAT HIS/HER CANDIDATURE AS CANCELLED BECAUSE ONLY PERMANENT/REGULAR DIET LECTURERS/TEACHER EDUCATORS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE TRAINING PROGRAMME. NO TA/DA WILL BE PAID TO SUCH PARTICIPANTS FOR REPORTING AT TRAINING VENUE AND THEY WILL BE SENT BACK IMMEDIATELY.
- Lecturer(s) who have previously attended an Orientation Course on Appreciation of the Arts organized by this Centre (CCRT) either at Delhi or in any other region should not attend this Orientation Course.
- <u>Only permanent/regular DIET Lecturers/Teacher Educators</u> up to the age of 52 years will be allowed to attend this Orientation Course. Keeping in mind the long working hours, it is presumed that only those will attend whose health permits.
- Principal/Librarian/PTI cannot come to attend the Orientation Course.
- The lectures will be delivered in English for the benefit of the lecturers participating from all parts of the country, therefore, an understanding and working knowledge of English language is essential. However, non-fluency should not deter the lecturer from joining the Orientation Course and in such cases we take care for getting the concepts comprehended.
- The participants should not be ill or visually impaired and should also not be suffering from any chronic disease.
- In case Lecturer does not fulfill the terms and conditions as referred above, may treat his/her candidature as cancelled and withdrawn and even if the lecturer comes to attend the Orientation Course, no TA/DA will be paid to him/her by this Centre (CCRT).

Annex II



MODULES OF THE PROGRAMME (SUBJECT AREAS)

- 1. Theoretical Study of Indian Art and Culture: Lectures and lecture demonstrations through which the fundamental aspects of the development of India's artistic heritage will be described and regional manifestations highlighted. Since the teaching subjects of the participants are very varied e.g. mathematics, science, language, social studies, we would like you to familiarize yourself before participation with basic knowledge of Indian History and with the General Geographical background of the Indian sub-continent.
- 2. Practical Training: Opportunities will be given to develop teaching skills and to learn crafts such as pottery, mask making, toy-making, tie & dye, rangoli, wall decoration and book binding etc. Innovative ideas like the use of movement and mime, puppetry and theatre techniques in classroom will also be taught in order to widen the perspective of the participants. Practice sessions are also organized in other academic areas and content of the programme like slide presentation and linking that information with curriculum subjects, learning of patriotic songs in national languages and in Yoga.
- **3. Preparation of Projects on methodologies for Linking Education with Culture:** Sessions on preparation of lesson plans, projects, games and other effective teaching aids (Please see Annexure III) to enhance teaching and to develop methodologies for classroom teaching will also be conducted. An attempt will be made to evolve interesting methods of evaluation, in order to enhance the effectiveness of teaching and learning.
- 4. Visits to Historical Monuments, Museums and Nature Parks: Visits will be arranged to local historical sites and monuments. Educational activities in museums and various art exhibitions and galleries will also be conducted. The participants will also be trained in simple techniques of conservation of arts and artifacts.

5. Other Educational Activities:

- An opportunity will be given to attend cultural shows and other events in the city, to enable participants to understand the continuity of some of the artistic traditions and to appreciate the latest developments in the field.
- Discussions sessions will be organized during which you will dwell upon the different aspects of education and how the knowledge of the natural and cultural resources can help in solving current problems related to education. The use of local resources for designing educational programmes will also be dealt with.
- **6. Evaluation:** Regular sessions will be organized in order to evaluate work done by the participants and test the knowledge gained by them during the various activities of the Orientation Course.

The active participation of participants, comprehension of lectures, is ascertained through discussions and evaluations during the Orientation Course. The participants also have to make an evaluation of the Orientation Course and give suggestions for the improvement of the same. This would facilitate the understanding of the theoretical knowledge given during the Orientation Course. We shall be grateful, if Lecturer would bring: 1) A prepared lecture with information on the State/UT also describing special features of the district and taluka, its art, culture and contribution in various fields. 2) Certificates and Items mentioned in Annex III, VI and VII so that participants of other States will be enriched and benefited.

Annex III



EDUCATIONAL KIT AND PUBLICATIONS:

During the Orientation Course, periodic assessment of the work will be made so that the Centre may send a report back to the concerned institute and respective State Education Department(s) on the interest and aptitude shown by the participants. On the basis of the assessment, evaluation(s) and subject to availability, an Educational Kit consisting of Publications & Cultural Software will be provided to the concerned Institution FREE OF COST.

The Cultural Software consists of Audio and Video CDs. Preference will be given to those institutes that have VCD/DVD in working condition. In turn, each lecturer trained by the Centre is expected to acquaint the students of his/her institution and the members of community at large with an understanding of the country's cultural heritage by using the cultural software, publications and the training received during the Orientation Course.

On the event that the institution may be gifted an Educational Kit consisting of Publications & Cultural Software, certificates as mentioned in Annex IV, are mandatory <u>complete in all respects and reproduced on the separate</u> letter heads (and in duplicate) of the institute with rubber stamp duly signed by the concerned Principal.

The usage of the Educational Kit in the institute entails extra work for the trained lecturer, hence Kit is provided subject to the following conditions:

- The interest shown by the lecturer in the Orientation Course;
- His/Her regular attendance and active participation in the activities of the Orientation Course.

The Educational Kit can not be claimed as a matter of right by the institution(s) from where a lecturer is trained.

Important

The CCRT has been training lecturers/teachers for their professional development for more than the last 30 years now from all parts of the country. The CCRT has not charged any money for this service to education as we have a mission and a dream to equip every DIET/Govt./Govt. aided schools with CCRT's Educational Kit. With gradual development of economic pressure towards self sustenance proving the advocacy of understanding of symbiotic relationship between culture and education; making the lecturer/teacher realize that training has a price - a publication of the <u>CCRT entitled NATIONAL SYMBOLS</u> will be given to all the participants for their school on a subsidized price and with discount. Annex V

1. **Boarding and Lodging:**

The boarding & lodging arrangements have been made at the venue of the Orientation Course.

The sessions will be arranged at the Lecture Hall/Auditorium of the venue of Orientation Course. Lecturer would be required to attend the Orientation Course from 9.00 AM to 5.30 PM. Some days we may begin work early in the morning and continue to work till late in the evening. No relatives/members of the family/escort will be entertained at the place where boarding and lodging arrangements have been made by the CCRT and no such permission will be provided under any circumstances.

Separate lodging arrangements are made for the female lecturers at the venue.

2. <u>Travelling Allowance</u>

- i) The participants of Training Programme are entitled to travel by AC 3-tier/ AC Chair Car/ Sleeper class of all the trains, as the case may be, from their nearest railway station to the venue of the programme by the shortest route.
- ii) Those who travel by bus from outstation are entitled to claim Deluxe bus fare subject to the production of bus ticket failing which the fare will be restricted to ordinary bus fare. Lecturers are required not to travel by AC buses.
- iii) For local road journey i.e. from school to railway station/ bus stand, the reimbursement will be made as actual distance or up to 8 km, whichever is less @ ₹ 4/- per km.
- iv) For local road journey from the nearest railway station/bus stand to the venue of the training programme, the teachers will be paid Auto/ Bus fare as per Centre's rule.

Please note that the Rail/Bus fare will be reimbursed by the CCRT if original/ photocopies of the tickets are attached to the T.A. Bills for inward as well as outward journey failing which the claim will be restricted to rail fare by sleeper class.

No break in journey is permissible as per rules. Lecturers are requested to buy direct journey ticket from their nearest railway station to the venue of the programme by the shortest route.

3. <u>Dearness Allowance</u>

The Lecturer/Teacher participants will be paid Dearness Allowance for attending the program based on the Vth Central pay Commission.

As the CCRT will be providing free lodging and boarding facilities mandatorily to all the participants, hence they will be given 25% of the rate of entitled Dearness Allowance.
